

# CALI VALE 2021 I JUNIOR PAN AMERICAN GAMES SAILING COMPETITION

30 November to 05 December, 2021

## NOTICE OF RACE

### **Include the following amendments:**

- 16/09/2021 – Appendix C, changed charter provider details and included due date for orders.

[NP] Denotes a rule that shall not be grounds for protests by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

### **1. RULES**

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), published by the World Sailing (WS). Other documents under RRS Definition: Rule (g) include:
- a) The Constitution of the Pan American Sports Organization.

    - Qualification System (QS)
    - Support Team Regulations (STR)
    - Equipment Regulations (ER)
    - Competition Area Regulations (CAR)
- 1.2 No National prescriptions will apply.
- 1.3 Class rules will apply except any class rule dealing with the conditions for organizing and running class championships shall not apply.
- 1.4 RRS Appendix P, Special Procedures for Rule 42 will apply.
- 1.5 RRS “Race Signal AP” is changed as follows: When flag AP is displayed ashore, ‘1 minute’ is replaced by ‘no later than 60 minutes’. The Sailing Instructions may also change other racing rules.
- 1.6 In all rules governing this regatta, both “athlete” and “competitor” mean a person competing in the event. The term “support team” means a person as defined in RRS.

- 1.7 In all rules governing this regatta:  
[SP] denotes a rule for which a standard penalty may be applied by the Race Committee or Technical Committee without a hearing or a discretionary penalty applied by the International jury with a hearing;
- 1.8 If there is a conflict between languages the language of the original version of the relevant document will take precedence.
- 1.9 Reasonable actions by regatta officials to implement recommendations, protocols or rules related to Covid-19, even later deemed not necessary, will not be considered improper actions or omissions. (Modify RRS 62.1(a))

## **2. IDENTIFICATION AND ADVERTISING**

- 2.1 Clothing and equipment worn or used by athletes and support personnel shall be in compliance with Rule 50 and the By-laws to Rule 50 of the Olympic Charter.
- 2.2. Except as permitted in this section, a boat shall not display any form of publicity or propaganda, commercial or otherwise, including the display of a boat name, home port or club name.
- 2.3 [DP] Boats and boards may be required to display “Look of the Games” logos, national country codes or national flags on each side of the hull. These will be supplied by the Organizing Authority and shall be applied under its direction.
- 2.4 When provided by the Organizing Authority, boats or competitors shall carry, display or wear the following as instructed:
- 2.4.1 Bibs for all competitors;
  - 2.4.2 Colored bibs for Event leaders (1st, 2nd and 3rd);
  - 2.4.3 Colored dots on the mainsail for Event leaders (1st, 2nd, 3rd);
  - 2.4.4 Bow number;
  - 2.4.5 Event advertising;
  - 2.4.6 Cameras and sound equipment or dummies if applicable;
- 2.5 [SP] For Olympic classes events, boats shall display national flags on mainsails as specified in their class rules.

## **3. COMMUNICATION**

- 3.1 The Official Notice Board will be online, location to be announced in the Sailing Instructions. It is up to each team member to provide an electronic device with internet access. A physical notice board in the venue will replicate the communications.

## **4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY**

- 4.1 Only competitors from Member National Authorities (MNA) affiliated with National Olympic Committees (NOC) recognized by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and the Pan-American Sports Organization (Panam Sports) may enter the regatta.
- 4.2 Only one boat or board per event per NOC may enter, subject to the qualification system established by the Pan American Sailing Federation (PASAF) and published by Cali-Valle 2021 Organising Committee and the maximum number of competitors identified in the Cali-Vale 2021 I Junior Pan-American Games Technical Manual for Sailing.
- 4.3 The World Sailing eligibility requirements shall apply. Each competitor shall be registered as a WS Sailor on the WS website.

- 4.4 Competitors may represent an NOC only if eligible to represent that NOC under IOC nationality rules. IOC nationality rules shall apply to all members of the crew. Each competitor shall present proof of nationality at the time of registration.

## 5. EVENTS AND QUOTAS

- 5.1 There shall be competition in the following events and classes:

- 5.2 Specification for iQFoil equipment is: Starboard iQFoil 95 Carbon Reflex board, the Severne HyperGlide Olympic rig in 9.0 (men) or 8.0 (Women) and the iQFoil Carbon foil by Starboards Foils.

## 6. REGISTRATION – DEADLINES FOR ENTRY-BY- NUMBER AND ENTRY-BYNAME

- 6.1 Sport Entries is the name of the official registration process for athletes selected and qualified to participate in the Cali-Valle 2021 I Junior Pan American Games. It is the responsibility of the National Olympic Committee (NOC) to decide upon the entry of athletes proposed by their respective National Federations (NF) and to ensure that such entries comply with the qualification standards established by the International Federation (IF), as well as the provision of the Pan American Sports Organization (Panam Sports) statute and the Pan Am Regulations. Specific details of how athletes are entered into each event can be found in the Cali-Vale 2021 Entries by Number Guide and the Cali-Valle 2021 Entry by Name Guide, both available at NOCs Extranet.

- 6.2 The final dates for NOCs to confirm are:

Confirmation of events/numbers: 25, August 2021, before 5:00 pm ET (10:00 UTC)

Confirmation of athlete's names: 04, November 2021, before 5:00 pm ET (10:00 UTC)

- 6.3 By the act of entering, all participants agree to be bound by the RRS and by all other rules that govern this event.

## 7. ON-SITE ENTRY CONFIRMATION

- 7.1 Athletes, coaches and team leaders shall submit the on-site entry confirmation form at the Race Office between 0800 - 1800 hours from 30 November to 01 December, 2021, prior to the start of their respective equipment inspection process.

- 7.2 From 30 November to 05 December 2021, the race office will be open from 0800 to 1800 daily.

## 8. FORMAT

8.1 The competition for one person dinghy events will consist of a series of six races and for the windsurfing events a series of nine races.

## 9. SCHEDULE

\* The Organizing Authority may reschedule a warning signal earlier than 1200. The Sailing Instructions will define this process.

9.2 Reserve day will be used for a specific event only if a specific number of races for the series is not completed and after 04 December 2021 races. These numbers are:

9.3 Number of races, races per day and target times will be as follows:

9.4 No warning signal will be made after 1630 on 04 december 2021 or 1400 on 05 December 2021 if needed to race on this last day.

9.5 All boats (including support vessels) must be on site by end of day, 01 December 2021.

## 10. EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

10.1 This event is an international event for the purpose of RRS G1.1.

10.2 A schedule of times when boats, crew and equipment must be presented for inspection will be posted no later than 1700 hours on Tuesday, 30 November 2021. Failure on the part of a competitor and his or her boat/board or equipment to be available for inspection at the required time may result in the competitor not being able to compete in one or more races. A competitor may not be eligible to compete until equipment inspection is officially completed.

10.3 The procedures for inspection, limitations on equipment permitted in the venue and other equipment related matters will be specified in the Sailing Instructions and/or the ER.

10.4 After equipment inspection, no boat or inspected equipment shall be taken from the boat park or the racing areas and their adjacent waters without written permission of the Organizing Authority.

10.5 Only entered competition boats may be kept in the venue boat park unless permission is granted by the Organizing Authority.

## 11. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

11.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available after 15 November 2021, posted at <http://panamsailing.org>.

## 12. VENUE AND COURSE AREA LOCATIONS

12.1 Appendix A shows the location of the venue.

12.2 Access to the Sailing Venue will be restricted to accredited athletes and support personnel.

12.3 The racing area will be in Calima lake, race areas location is shown in Appendix B. Decision to race on each area will be made by Race Committee on the previous day. However, racing may also be moved to other locations on the lake.

### **13 .THE COURSES**

13.1 The courses will be Windward/Leeward or Trapezoid courses.

### **14. PENALTY SYSTEM**

14.1 Decisions of the International Jury will be final as provided in RRS 70.5.

### **15. SCORING**

15.1 The Low Point System of RRS Appendix A will apply, as modified herein. RRS B8 is deleted.

15.2 One (1) race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

15.3 A boat's score in the series will be the total of her race scores, with the following discards:

15.3.1 For One Person Dinghy male and female: if four or more races are completed a boat's score in the series will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

15.3.2 For Windsurfing male and female: if five or more races are completed a boat's score in the series will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

### **16. SUPPORT VESSELS**

16.1 A support vessel includes any boat that is under the control or direction of a person who is providing physical or advisory support to an athlete, including the gathering of data that may be used at a later time.

16.2 Each National Olympic Committee is permitted to register a maximum of one support vessel per event in which it has a boat competing.

16.3 The Organizing Authority may, at its discretion, refuse support vessels entry to the venue if they are deemed unsuitable. Generally, open boats less than 7.6 meters in length, having minimal or no superstructure (cabin, coach house, bridge etc.), will be considered suitable.

16.4 All support vessels must be pre-registered with Cali-Valle 2021 Organising Committee, Martha Juliana de Acevedo at director.albatros@gmail.com no later than 27 November, 2021. NOCs wishing to charter a support vessel shall make arrangements independently of the Organizing Authority. Please refer to more information in Appendix C.

16.5 All support vessel shall be registered at the Race Office no later than 1800 hours on Wednesday 01 December 2021. A registration fee of USD 200 for each support vessel has to be paid at registration, **in cash only**. This fee is waived if that support boat is shared by two or more countries.

16.6 All registered support vessels must comply with the Cali-Valle 2021 Support Team Regulations. Limitations of equipment that may be carried and mandatory equipment that shall be carried on support vessels will be confirmed in the Cali-Valle 2021 Support Team Regulations.

16.7 **[DP]** Support vessels shall display the country code(s) of the country/countries on board at all times while on the water. Identification will not be provided by the Organizing Authority.

### **17. EQUIPMENT**

17.1 Each competitor and MNA is responsible for providing their own boat and equipment for competition. Competitors and MNA's wishing to charter a boat for competition shall make all arrangements independently of the Organizing Authority. Please refer to more information in Appendix C.

### **18. [DP] BERTHING**

18.1 Competition and support vessels shall be kept in their assigned places while they are in the Regatta Venue.

### **19. COMMUNICATION**

19.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make voice or data transmissions while racing nor receive voice or data communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

## **20. PRIZES**

20.1 Medals will be awarded to the top three boats in each event. Diplomas will be awarded to the fourth to eighth place finishers in each event.

## **21. DOPING CONTROL**

21.1 During the period of the Cali-Valle I Junior Pan American Games, which starts on 25 November and ends on 05 December 2021, the IOC Anti-Doping Rules (compliant with the World Anti-Doping Code and the mandatory International Standards) will apply.

21.2 Cali-Valle 2021 Organising Committee will be authorized to collect samples on behalf of the IOC. The doping control station will be located inside the sailing venue.

## **22. [DP] MEDIA RIGHTS**

22.1 By participating in the event athletes and support teams automatically grant to the Organizing Authority, their sponsors, World Sailing and Pan American Sailing Federation the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of the competition without compensation.

22.2 Boats may be required to carry cameras, camera dummies, mounts, sound equipment or positioning systems as specified by the Organizing Authority.

22.3 Athletes may be required to pass through the mixed zone on return to shore after racing.

22.4 All medalists shall be required to attend a media conference after the prize giving. Athletes may also be required to attend a media conference at the end of the day's racing.

22.5 Athletes may also be asked to be available for interviews outside the formal mixed zone and media conferences, on either training or competition days.

## **23. CODE OF CONDUCT**

23.1 Competitors and support team shall comply with any reasonable request from a regatta official.

23.2 [SP] Boats not racing shall avoid the area where boats are racing and of any official boats.

## **24. RISK STATEMENT**

24.1 Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. Competitors and support persons participate in the event entirely at their own risk. RRS 3 states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone." By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- By participating in any race, they are satisfied that their boat is in good order, complies with the class rules, is equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- The provision of a race management team, patrol boats, umpires and other officials and volunteers by the organizer does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- It is their responsibility to familiarize themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

## **25. [NP] INSURANCE**

- 25.1 Each 'person in charge'(see RRS 46) shall hold a valid insurance certificate showing proof of third-party liability coverage of at least USD 500,000 (or equivalent) per incident.
- 25.2 Each support boat shall have valid insurance including third party liability coverage of at least US\$ 500,000 (or equivalent) per incident.
- 25.3 The Organizing Authority is not responsible for verifying the status of certificates.

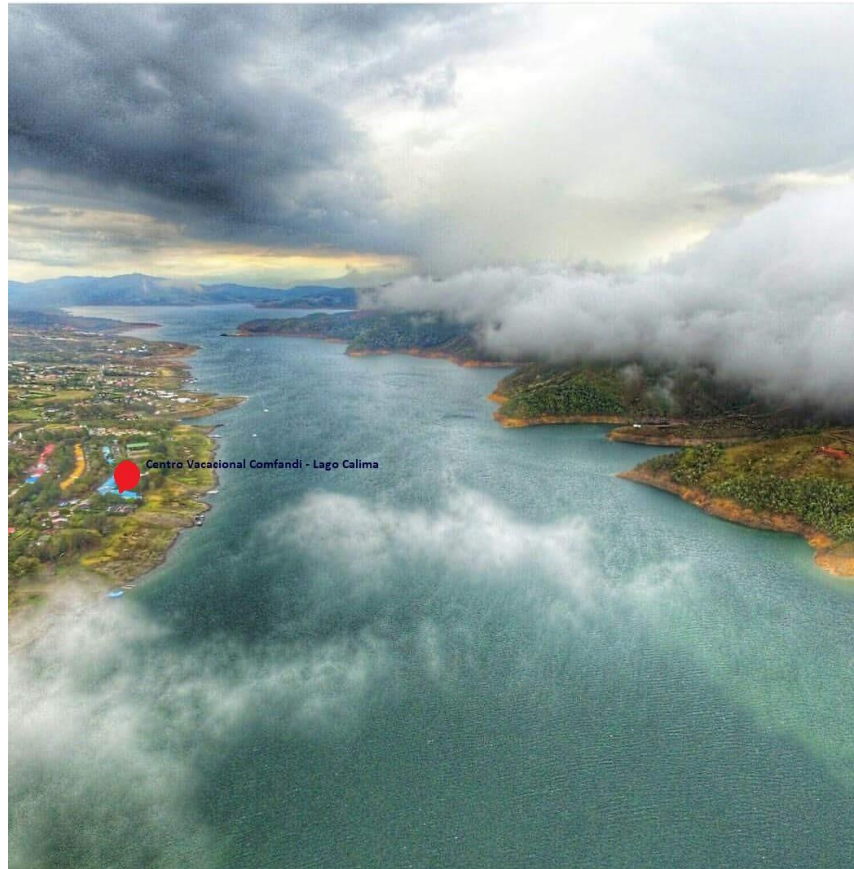
